

Modified U11 Rules

2025 Version

1. Pitching distance will be 30 feet for the season.
2. There will be no walks up to and including May 1. After 4 balls a coach will pitch from the bottom of the 30 foot pitching circle. The number of balls soft tossed will be according to strikes already taken. NOTE: if a player has 2 strikes after 4 balls, then the player gets 1 soft toss. If it is a poor pitch by coach they can get another pitch. NOTE: If a player gets hit by a pitch, she has the option of still getting to finish her bat, if she wishes, and it is a NO pitch up to including May 1, 2025 EFFECTIVE May 5 the game is played by Softball BC rules(Above rules are removed)
3. There will be no stealing bases until May 1 and effective May 5 you can steal as below:
A) Steal 1 base at a time. No 2nd stealing of bases if for example a catcher overthrows the pitcher throwing the ball back.
B) No stealing of home all season. Only advancement to home would be if forced in from 3rd base on a walk, hit by pitch, or ball is hit.
4. There will be 10 players allowed on the field, the 10th player being the rover. Rover MUST be in the outfield.
5. A pitcher is only allowed to pitch 2 innings max per game. If she enters late in an inning it would count as an inning. NOTE: 1 pitch= 1 inning.
6. 4 runs limit per inning.
7. All games start at 6:30 with no new inning after 8:00pm DROP DEAD TIME 8:15pm
NOTE: May be called at any point due to darkness.
8. If the ball is overthrown to any base on an infield play(A hit) the base runners may only advance one base. If runners occupy all the bases, the advancement of one base will allow a single runner to come home. If a play is attempted to get an advancing runner out and is overthrown, no additional bases allowed. NOTE: If the ball is hit in the outfield the runners can advance as far as they can until the ball is thrown into the infield and the runners must stop at the base they are going to at the time the ball enters the infield. This is not considered a steal.
9. If a pitcher hits 2 batters in an inning, the coach should consider removing the pitcher for the remainder of that inning. NOTE: An umpire could consider the pitcher out of control and let the coach know that the pitcher cannot hit another batter in that inning.
